Formal elements of three-dimensional form. Application of the principles of organization as a means for producing creative solutions for the artist and designer. Related practical experience with a variety of materials and processes.

HA 389 Meathods in and Approaches to Art History

3 credits

(HA 101 or 102) and (HA 260 or 271) Completion of Tier I Writing Requirement Art historical research, meathods of critical analysis, and the historiography of a field. SPRING OF EVERY YEAR

HA 499 Senior Research and Professional Development Seminar

3 credit

Completion of Tier I Writing Requirement Development of critical professional skills, including critical research and professional writing skills, resume/curriculum vitae, letters of application, grants, fellowship writing, communication and presentation skills. 3 credits

No Prerequisite

Latin America's cultural pluralism and art production beginning in pre-Columbian times and following through to the present. Various functions of art as well as the relationship between objects, artisits, and the cultures from which they come.

3 credits

No Prerequisite

Asian civilization viewed thematically through selected masterpieces of visual arts. Main trends of Asian Arts through a range of time periods. FALL + SPRING OF EVERY YEAR

HA 261 Modern Asian Art

3 credits

No Prerequisite

Moderism, modern visual culture, and contemporary art across the Asian continent, including painting, sculpture, design, photography, popular arts, and new media, structured geographically and thematically, considered through a variety of historical, social, political, and cultural perspectives.

HA 271 African Art

3 credits

No Prerequisite

Survey of visual arts from the continent of Africa including ancient to contemporary architecture, sculpture, textiles, painting, photography, performance, and body decoration. Structured geographically and thematically, artworks are considered through a variety of historical, social, political, philosophical, and cultural perspectives. FALL OF EVERY YEAR

FALL + SPRING OF EVERY YEAR

Second-year competency in a foreign language is pertinent to the student's overall plan of study. To graduate Studio Art students must complete four semesters of a single language (or equivallent with placement testing).

A student who has studied a foreign language in high school and (1) wishes to enroll for a course in the language or (2) wishes to use it to meet the graduation requirement will need to consider the following. Students anticipating AP or IB credit (HL) in a foreign language should NOT take a language placement test and will need to contact the appropriate language adviser regarding placement.
